Implications of ECFA

- Enhanced economic relationship with other countries
- Taiwan as a "gateway to China"
- More PRC investment to Taiwan
- More foreign investment to Taiwan

PRC Investment into Taiwan

- Still a lot of hurdles
- Only 192 categories approved by MOEA
- Most are "yesterday industries"
- Technology and financial industries are mostly excluded
- No further opening until the year-end election is over

China's Influence on Taiwan

- More PRC tourists visiting Taiwan
- More procurement of Taiwanese goods (TFT-LCD panel etc.)
- More PRC investment into Taiwan?
- Acer/Founder strategic partnership
- Beijing Oriental acquisition of Mei-Chi
- 16 "Cross-strait bridge-building" projects

Japanese Investment/Partnership with Taiwan

- Strong interest due to Taiwan's tie with Japan and China
- Investment "through Taiwan" to China
- "Nike" theory
- Cooperation and strategic alliance in tech industries
